## **Assessment Process**

Every five years, the county continues the health assessment process to re-assess the strengths and needs of the county. This year Mayo Clinic Health System - Red Cedar partnered with the Dunn County Health Department to implement the assessment process.

In January 2011, the group used the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Com-

munity Health Assessment and Group Evaluation (CHANGE) tool to guide the process (www.cdc.gov). The team chose the tool because it combines items that have scientific support for policy, systems and environmental changes with items that communities are initiating and assessing. By supporting the collection of data from a variety of sources, CHANGE provides a community snapshot and helps identify areas for improvement.
