Jeans & Jewels: Record-breaking Year!

Over 280 guests gathered in the Great Hall at UW-Stout's Memorial Student Center to celebrate our 2023 Jeans & Jewels Gala where the community smashed previous records for total money raised, as well as a monumental record for Dessert Dash. In total, the community helped us raise over \$116,000 with \$25,000 coming from the Dessert Dash and over \$46,000 raised through sponsorships. A new element at Jeans & Jewels this year was a Door Prize sponsored by Synergy Retirement Planning. Every person attending the Gala received a ticket to enter into a drawing for a 1-night stay at the Kalahari Resort in the Wisconsin Dells as well as a \$500 Visa gift card. The Grant: Career Launch for Teens

The Boy & Girls Club - Menomonie Center sought funds to support its Career Launch program that focuses on encouraging teens to assess their skills and interests, explore careers, make sound educational decisions and prepare to join the workforce. A \$2,500 grant from the Women's Giving Circle purchased virtual reality equipment that exposes teens to over 300 simulations for different careers and help fund hands-on and educational field trips focusing on geology and environmental careers.

Virtual Career Exploration

When the Boys & Girls Club - Menomonie opened a second location at the middle school to help increase services in Dunn County, there were a few students struggling in school. It had been a tough transition from being at home during Covid to being full time in person at school. Several students were struggling to get homework or classwork done from the very beginning of the school year. One student had repeatedly said to staff that they didn't need to do their homework because they were not planning on graduating from high school anyway and would head straight into the workforce. Through the Career Launch program, this member was able to explore various different careers through virtual simulations, guest speakers, and field trips, exploring several opportunities he never thought possible.

Promise Award for Women Delivers Again

Congratulations to Abbie Aasen for receiving the 2023 Barb Schmelzle Promise Award for Women! Abbie is a psychology major with a criminal justice minor and aspires to work with incarcerated juveniles. She is driven to continue on to graduate school for criminology or forensic psychology. Along the way, Abbie hopes to give back to the foster community through advocacy or by working with that population who are incarcerated. Abbie said the award will help her pay tuition.

"The award given to me will help me graduate with much less debt than the average student and it's one obstacle I won't have to face while in school," Abbie said.

Abbie is the fourth student to receive the Promise Award, established in 2020 by Barb's husband, Tom, and her family following Barb's passing in 2019. They created this fund to honor her love of learning and ability to connect with people on a deep, personal level.

This award is given to help non-traditional female students experiencing financial need and who have experienced extreme and adverse life experiences make progress towards furthering their education in any field.

Honor a Veteran in Your Life with a Memorial Brick



The Community Foundation is now accepting requests for new bricks for the Dunn County Veterans Memorial located at 6th Ave. and Crescent Street in downtown Menomonie. The Veterans Memorial Brick program began on Flag Day, June 14, 2000 when over 300 bricks were dedicated and the monument unveiled. The monument honors military veterans from any branch of service during any era. There is no residency requirement, and currently over 500 veterans are honored.

The Dunn County Veterans Memorial Committee of Downtown Menomonie, Inc. is responsible for the memorial and programs. The Community Foundation of Dunn County coordinates the brick program and manages

the Dunn County Veterans Memorial Endowment Fund, which was established to maintain the memorial area.
